Marriage symbolizes the intimate bonding of two lives, but does not diminish their individuality.

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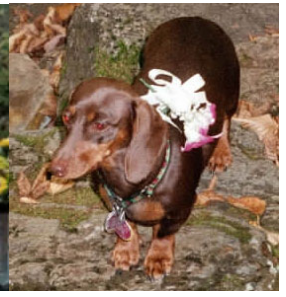
Marriage symbolizes life and learning, rising to meet new challenges and continuing to grow.
